




Chose an area with trees that give some shade.



Pick an area with plants and trees, but avoid planting next to tree roots.




Do not do slash-and-burn (milpa) in the selected area.




Planting







Maintenance



Cut weeds and drop leaves and weeds on the ground to enrich the soil.





Harvesting & Cleaning



Wash yellow ginger roots in a basin, and do not put dirty water in the creeks and rivers.



Harvest yellow ginger when the leaves turn brown and the roots are orange. Keep the small roots to replant.
